MODES of STUDY.

HOW MUCH TIME WILL YOU DEDICATE TO STUDYING?

A study load refers to the amount of study you will undertake in a period, and it can be

FULL-TIME STUDY:

Involves most of your week dedicated to classes and coursework: 30–40 hours for university and over 15 hours for TAFE.

PART-TIME STUDY:

Involves a reduced study load, extending the program but offering more flexibility, with at least 12 hours per week at university.





HOW AND WHERE DO YOU WANT TO STUDY?

Delivery mode refers to the format in which a course is taught and accessed by students. The main delivery modes include:

FACE-TO-FACE:


You will attend lectures, tutorials, and practical sessions in person on campus.

ONLINE:

You can engage in your study from anywhere, using a computer.

BLENDED:

A mix of face-to-face and online learning components, with some units requiring in-person workshops, particularly for more practical areas of study.

ONLINE THROUGH UNE.



Most CUCSM students study online, with 26 enrolled at UNE in 2024. Known for its strong distance education program, UNE offers flexible, self-paced study.

Ideal for those working, with family commitments, or unable to travel, **UNE** provides expert support for its students globally.



COURSES.

'Pathways' or 'bridging' courses can help you get into a university course if you don't have the right qualifications straight away. These are usually short, free and sometimes count towards your degree.

Previous international study may be considered when applying. Each university and TAFE has different application processes, so it's best to contact them for advice.

Contact the university or TAFE directly for the best information on entry pathways.



EXPERIENCE.

Work experience can get you into a course, or even make your course shorter!

OTHER STUDY.

A Certificate IV or Diploma can get you into university. They can also take time directly off your degree.

ABOUT MONEY? SPECIFICALLY FEES!

Understanding the fee structure can be confusing, but these are the basics you should know.

WHAT WILL YOU PAY?

Tuition fees cover course costs like staff, equipment, and libraries and are required for all students.

UNIVERSITY:

University fees vary by study area. Some courses offer domestic students a Commonwealth Supported Place (CSP) with government subsidies.

TAFE:

At TAFE, tuition fees vary, and there are free courses! The best way to calculate TAFE fees is to visit their website and use their handy fee calculator.

HOW WILL YOU PAY?

You can pay in two ways - upfront or deferred loan.

UPFRONT:

You personally cover the cost of the fees, usually every semester. This is for international students, or those wanting to pay upfront.

DEFERRED:

Deferred payments are governmentsupported loans repaid when you reach a certain income. Eligibility depends on your course & residency.

ASK YOUR UNI OR TAFE PROVIDER:







Bronte deferred the payment of her undergraduate degree, placing the university fees onto HECS (Higher Education Contribution Scheme). She received no scholarships for this degree. For her honours degree, she received a scholarship through her university, the University of Canberra which contributed to the cost of studying. For both her undergraduate and honours degree, she received a Commonwealth Support Place (CSP).

FINANCIAL SUPPORT.

There are several ways you can access financial support during your studies. Scholarships or bursaries are the most common. While many people believe scholarships are only awarded for excellent academic results, this is not the case. There are many scholarships provided to students from a variety of backgrounds, including but not limited to the following:

The best place to start is with your university provider as they will usually have a website dedicated to the scholarships on offer at that institution. Some of these scholarships will be more general while others are offered based on faculty or area of study.

THE APPLICATION PROCESS

Applying for degrees, scholarships, grants, placements, and other programs can be as challenging as the degree itself! While you can get free help from the CUC, here are some top tips.

When applying for something, read the instructions carefully, as requirements vary. Some common documents include:



RESUME

Up to date and tailored to the purpose.



COVER LETTER

One A4 page with good spelling, grammar, and formatting.



A LETTER FROM YOUR EMPLOYER

May be requested if you are applying for a degree where your work experience is relevant.



TRANSCRIPT

Outlines previous qualifications you have studied, even if you didn't finish.

GOOD ANSWERS ARE ALSO KEY TO A QUALITY APPLICATION

A good way to structure your answers is using the STAR method, which can be used in written applications and interviews!

SITUATION



Explain the situation just enough to give context – they don't need to know every detail!

ABOUT 20% OF YOUR RESPONSE.

TASK



Now outline the task, challenge, or event you are going to explain. This should be a specific example relevant to the question.

ABOUT 10% OF YOUR RESPONSE.

ACTION



Describe the actions you took, highlighting the skills or character traits that were mentioned in the question.

ABOUT 60% OF YOUR RESPONSE.

RESULTS



What were the positive results, or the outcome of your actions?

ABOUT 10% OF YOUR RESPONSE.

Here is a simple example of some ways you could start answering the question "How will your degree contribute to rural communities in the future?"

PROVIDING CONTEXT.



"Rural communities like Cooma struggle to retain skilled workers..."

DESCRIBE THE PROBLEM.



"Our community needs passionate nurses who are willing to stay in our town long term. I began nursing motivated by this cause and have taken steps to make sure my degree enables me to contribute in this way..."

DESCRIBE THE ACTIONS.



"For example, I arranged all of my placements in rural NSW to better equip me for rural nursing. This has included managing increased workloads and creating good community connections in the places I have worked. One experience that was particularly impactful was..."

EXPLAIN THE OUTCOMES.



"Ultimately, I am gaining confidence in rural health settings and intend to return to Cooma to work as a nurse upon graduation..."
